EUROPEAN FISHERIES CONTROL AGENCY (EFCA) – CONTRIBUTION TO TITLES 1, 2 AND 3.

Legal basis: Article 35(1) of Council Regulation (EC) No 768/2005 of 26 April 2005 establishing a Community Fisheries Control Agency and amending Regulation (EEC) No 2847/93 establishing a control system applicable to the common fisheries policy (OJ L 128, 21.5.2005, p. 1).

Subject: The subsidy is intended to cover the Agency's staff and administrative expenditure and operating expenditure. The European Fisheries Control Agency was created by Council Regulation (EC) n° 768/2005 of 26 April 2005. Its mission is defined in Article 3. The agency has been operational since 2007. Its estimated budget for 2014 is conform to the draft budget proposed by the European Commission and shall be voted during the Board of Directors of 15 October 2013

Amount: € 9 217 150 (corresponding to an appropriation of € 8 716 900 and an amount of € 500 250 coming from the recovery of surplus).
